Methods of instructions	<p>The general part of the course will be focused on knowledge transfer through face-to-face lessons and field seminars with professionals working on EU projects. During the course, lectures will mix with spontaneous interactive debates, aiming to test students' knowledge and understanding.</p> <p>The following teaching methods will be used:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Lectures: interactive lectures to introduce the key concepts, principles, and models, multimedia presentations, real-life examples, and case studies to enhance understanding and engagement.• Group Discussions: group discussions to encourage active participation and critical thinking among participants. specific topics or case studies for small group discussions, followed by a collective sharing of insights and conclusions.• Case Studies: case studies that illustrate the different course topics. Divide participants into small groups and assign each group a case study to analyze, discuss, and present their findings. This approach helps develop problem-solving skills and practical application of knowledge.• Online Resources: participants receive access to online resources such as articles, reports, videos, and interactive modules related to course topics.

It then provides an overview of the EU unique institutional set up, as it's neither an international organization nor a country, of the main institutions involved in EU decision-making process and of the EU institutional ecosystem. Then the EU Financial framework will be presented as serves as a foundation for more detailed policies and actions. Finally, the Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF) will be explained in detail as well as the programs funded under the multiannual financial framework 2021-2027.
